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Form Instructions

For each set of plates, there is a \$4 mailing fee payable to Division of Motor Vehicles.

INDIAN TRIBAL - (SDCL 32-5-123) - Any resident may obtain Indian tribal plates. To receive the plates, the applicant must have registered his vehicle, paid the current year's county plate fees, and provide proof of such by sending a copy of the current vehicle registration form with the application. The Indian tribal plates must be displayed on the vehicle in place of the regular number plates which must be kept in the vehicle.

CONSTRUCTION - (SDCL 32-9-3) - Any of the following vehicles, when used exclusively on the job site, to move between job sites or from a job site to a central operational location may, upon inspection and approval by the Highway Patrol, apply for special construction license plates. Motor vehicles, trailers, semi-trailers, and motor propelled or trailed vehicle chassis registered in South Dakota are all eligible when used for construction of highways, stock water dugouts, dam, farm and ranch irrigation systems or other soil and water conservation projects on farms or ranches, and which are used exclusively on the job site. Each unit must display a separate license plate.

FIREFIGHTERS - (SDCL 32-5-113) - Any resident, currently certified and recognized by the State Fire Marshal's office, qualifies to apply for a special firefighter license plate. To receive a plate the applicant must have registered his vehicle, paid the current year's county plate fees, and provide proof of such by sending a copy of their current vehicle registration form with their application. The firefighter plates must be displayed on the vehicle in place of the regular number plates which must be kept in the vehicle. As soon as an applicant dies or otherwise becomes disqualified, the firefighter license plate must be surrendered to the county treasurer of the county where the applicant lives.

HISTORICAL CARS AND MOTORCYCLES - (SDCL 32-5-77 & 32-5-77.3) - Any resident who owns a motor vehicle/motorcycle which is more than 30 years old may apply for "historical car"/"motorcycle" license plates which are permanent for the life of the vehicle/motorcycle. Vehicles displaying such plates can only be used for special occasions such as displays, parades, exhibitions, tours, and similar uses, and may be driven to service stations or garages for fuel and repairs. It may not be used for general transportation purpose unless it displays regular number plates issued by the county treasurer. Regular license plates issued by this state in the same year as the year of the vehicle (this does not pertain to motorcycles) may be used on the historical vehicle in lieu of historic license plates, but must be registered through the Division of Motor Vehicles.

AMATEUR AND COMMERCIAL RADIO - (SDCL 32-5-65) - Any motor vehicle owner who holds a current unrevoked FCC amateur radio license, or any commercial radio station (broadcasting company) which holds an unrevoked FCC broadcast license may apply for special plates which display radio call letters. Such applicant's vehicles must be currently registered with all fees paid as evidenced by a copy of current registration form which must accompany the application. Plates issued to the applicant will bear the applicant's assigned station call letters (up to a maximum of 7 characters). The radio plates must be displayed on the vehicle in place of the regular number plates which must be kept in the vehicle.

VETERANS PLATES - (SDCL 32-5-108, 109, 109.1) - Qualifying residents of this state may apply for Disabled American Veteran (DAV), Prisoner of War (POW), or Pearl Harbor Survivor (PHS) license plates. (Refer to the statutes cited above for specific qualifications for plate issuance.) The annual fee for these plates is \$10.00 per set per year. Applicant must furnish proof of payment of regular county vehicle registration fees for the current year, and upon verification of payment, the regular fees will be refunded for the unused portion of the registration year. Once issued, annual renewals will be handled by the County Treasurer's office. As soon as an applicant dies or otherwise becomes disqualified, the special veteran license plates must be surrendered to the county treasurer of the county where the applicant lives.

PURPLE HEART - (SDCL 32-5-109.2) - Qualifying residents of this state may apply for Purple Heart license plates. A copy of DD Form 214, discharge papers, must be attached to the application to verify eligibility. Payment of the regular plate fee is required and no fee is assessed for the distinctive plates. Applicant is limited to two sets of these plates. Once issued, annual renewals will be handled by the County Treasurer's Office. As soon as an applicant dies or otherwise becomes disqualified, the special plates must be surrendered to the County Treasurer's Office.

NATIONAL GUARD - (SDCL 32-5-55) - A resident of this state who owns a vehicle and who is a regularly enlisted or commissioned member of the SD National Guard, other than an inactive member thereof, or a retired member with 20 years or more of creditable service may obtain National Guard license plates. Such applicant's vehicle must be currently registered with all fees paid as evidenced by a copy of the current registration form. The National Guard plates must be displayed on the vehicle in place of the regular number plates which must be kept in the vehicle. If discharged, separated or furloughed to a reserve or inactive status, the plates must be surrendered.
