South Dakota Dealer Waiver

A Complete and submit this waiver to the South Dakota Motor Vehicle Division.

Instructions

- South Dakota statute 32-6B-5.1, allows out-of-state dealers to attend events in South Dakota by purchasing a temporary permit.
- An out-of-state trailer dealer, may only sell new trailers that are franchised in this state, if the franchised South Dakota dealer submits their approval in writing in the form of a waiver.
- This waiver must be completed by all SD dealers that carry the franchise of trailer being brought into this state.
- This waiver must accompany the Application for Temporary Manufacturer, Customizer, or Dealer Permit.
- This waiver does not preclude the South Dakota dealer from attending the same event as allowed by law.

SDCL 32-6B-5.1 (3) Any person may sell trailers at an event, if the event lasts three or more days and if the person registers and purchases a permit from the Department of Revenue. Before issuance of a permit, the person shall provide proof the person is a licensed dealer in the person's own state and has no outstanding dealer violations. **The permit may only be issued if the trailers being sold are not franchised in this state unless the person obtains a written waiver from any similarly franchised dealer in this state. The person should present the waiver to the department at the time the person applies for the permit.** If the permit is purchased in advance of the event, the person shall pay a fee of two hundred fifty dollars for a fifteen-day temporary permit. Regardless of whether or not there is a franchise in this state, any person may display a trailer at an event. If the permit is purchased at the event, the person shall pay a fee of five hundred dollars for the temporary permit. Any person found to be in violation of the provisions of this subdivision shall be denied a temporary permit for a period of one year from the date of violation;
